Tax Credit Donations

Parents and community members are encouraged to take advantage of the AZ tax law that allows taxpayers a credit of up to \$200 per individual and \$400 for joint tax returns per each calendar year, when they contribute to extracurricular activities. Donations are used for countless needs, such as new music and equipment, festival fees, busing for field trips, instrument repairs, concert needs, recording equipment, sectional coaching, and general band program necessities.

Band Boosters

Band Boosters support the band through fundraising and volunteering time and energy in countless ways. Our program thrives because of our fabulously supportive community and *we NEED your support to continue the tradition*. Band Boosters is a perfect place for you to be involved in junior high. (You can choose to do a lot, or just a little, but either way we are grateful!)

Classroom Expectations

Rules

1. Be on time and prepared for class
2. Be respectful (people and equipment)
3. Give your personal best (attitude and effort)

Consequences

1. Verbal warning
2. Possible new seat - Parent Communication Form may be sent home
3. Parent phone call/email and/or referral to administration

Grading

Participation Points (40% of grade) are earned for all required materials each day and fully participating in each rehearsal.

Written Work Points (20% of grade) are given for worksheets, quizzes, and tests covering a variety of basic music theory concepts.

Performance Points (20% of grade) are earned for individual Playing Tests. Playing Tests may include scales, etudes, sight-reading, and concert music. Students are assessed on: notes, rhythm, articulation, dynamics, phrasing, and tone quality.

Percussionists are expected to perform on both snare drum and mallet percussion. Their test material may also include snare drum rudiments.

Concerts (20% of grade) are awarded for:

- being in full uniform
- arriving on time
- staying for the entire concert
- appropriate audience/on-stage etiquette
- having all materials

*Except for emergencies, absences from performances may only be excused by a note and/or phone call from home being received by Mrs. Moorhead no later than two weeks **prior** to the anticipated absence. In the case of an emergency, a phone call or note from home should be received as soon as possible. A make-up assignment will be provided if the absence is excused.*

BINDER: Students need a black .5 or 1-inch binder and at least 15 sheet protectors for sheet music and additional test material that will be provided by the school.

BOOKS: Students may be issued a book from the school at the beginning of the school year. You do NOT need to buy any books this year.

FLUTISTS: Tuning rod and cloth.

REED PLAYERS: Clarinet and sax players need to have **four** working reeds AT ALL times. We recommend Van Doren (2 1/2 or 3). Broken or worn reeds must be replaced. You will also need a reed guard, cork grease and cleaning swab.

TRUMPET/EUPHONIUM/TUBA PLAYERS: Brass players need valve oil (Al Cass preferred), tuning slide grease (Selmer Tuning Slide and Cork Grease preferred), and a mouthpiece brush. Trumpets may also need to buy a straight mute if any of our concert selections require it.

TROMBONE PLAYERS: Trombone players need slide cream (Trombotine or Slide-Mix preferred) and a small spray bottle for water.

FRENCH HORN PLAYERS: French horn players need rotor oil (Hetman 11) and tuning slide grease (Hetman Slide Gel preferred).

PERCUSSIONISTS: Percussionists need a pair of snare drum sticks (SD1 or 5a), and medium or medium-soft yarn mallets. Students will occasionally play timpani, and may choose to purchase his/her own staccato timpani mallets, though they are not required. Also, percussionists need access to some type of keyboard for at home practice (keyboard, piano, bell kit, etc).

A stick bag and practice pad are recommended, too, but also not required.

SCHOOL OWNED INSTRUMENTS: Students using school owned instruments should purchase their own mouthpiece if possible. Mouthpiece suggestions are listed on the Website.

Performance Attire

Boys: A collared, button up, long sleeve WHITE shirt.

Girls: A modest solid WHITE shirt/blouse that covers the shoulders and stomach.

ALL members need solid black pants (no capris, shorts or leggings), black socks (or nylons), and solid black close-toed shoes. Please, no rips or tears in the pants and no tennis shoes.

If you are unable to meet these expectations, please notify the director immediately so arrangements may be made.

Instrument Quality

Please be aware that the quality of instrument that your student plays on can dramatically affect their success and thereby their enjoyment of the experience. Most rental places in our area are good about this. However, if you are considering purchasing an instrument for your student, please use caution and I urge you NOT to buy the cheapest instrument available. Also, BEWARE of purchasing an instrument off of the internet as it is difficult to know its true quality. I would be happy to make suggestions should you need assistance.

A Note About Dental Work

Please note that most dental work, especially any orthodontic work, affects the musicians' ability to produce sound on their instruments! I kindly request that you consider this for your student when scheduling appointments. Please try to avoid concert days and the days leading up to a concert as it can be quite frustrating for a musician to make adjustments unless given ample time.

School Loaned Instruments

The school is only able to loan out larger instruments: tuba, euphonium, French horn , bari sax, tenor sax, bassoon, and a few others. If you are requesting the use of a school instrument, please complete the appropriate form and Mrs. Moorhead will contact you if we are *unable* to meet your request. Please note that there is a recommended usage fee \$25 per semester (or \$50 per year).
